- In an effort to prevent turf damage at the RiverClub, we have placed large coquina boulders in specific areas.
- We are looking forward to debuting a quick-service window at the RiverCafe in hopes of quicker service of items.



RiverHouse

- The RiverHouse Pool Furniture has been power washed and cleaned up for the Summer.
- The RiverHouse Feature pump is down, our team is hard at work devising a fix.
- We have placed a temporary light by the stairway leading to the RiverHouse until the parts are received to bring the original light back to working order.
- All chairs and umbrellas have been gone through to ensure functionality. The maintenance team will be sure to assess throughout the season and fix items that are damaged or broken.



Common Areas

- The light pole in the northern roundabout, which was damaged due to a traffic accident, has been replaced.
- The plants on the bridge leading from Main Street to the Homestead on Kendall Crossing have been replaced.
- The electrical boxes near the pond on Sternwheel and the northern roundabout have been replaced due to excessive corrosion.



- The Zoysia and Bermuda grass has been cut down to the proper height. You may see a white coloring while it adapts to its new height.
- Teams are removing the Spanish Moss from the RiverHouse trees and trees around the neighborhood.
- Yellowstone is hopeful the mulching of the entire neighborhood will be completed by the end of this month.



What to Plant in April

Easily transplant: boniato, gingers, roselle, tomatillo, and tomatoes.

Transplant with care: amaranth, calabaza, long squash, luffa, papaya, Seminole pumpkin, and sweet potatoes.

Use seeds: beans (bush, lima, pole), cantaloupes, chayote, corn, cucumbers, okra, peanuts, peas (southern), squashes, and watermelon.
